

uniform changes

Please take note of the changes in uniform for day one of next term:

Girls

- Skirt length to be no more than 6 cm off the floor when kneeling.
- Navy tights or navy knee-length socks are the <u>only</u> options to be worn. (<u>No</u> white socks to be worn during the entire year.)
- Tie is still compulsory for terms 2 & 3 and optional for terms 1 & 4.
- Either short or long sleeved shirt can be worn all year round. If the short sleeved shirt is preferred, it must be the new stiff collar short sleeved shirt, not the old style summer shirt.
- Black leather lace up school shoes with a heel for terms 2 & 3

Boys

- Optional to wear either regulation long pants or school shorts all year.
- Regulation grey school shorts with elastic waist or tailored style can be worn all year round with either;
 - Plain grey knee-length school socks and black leather lace up school shoes, with a heel <u>OR</u> plain black roman sandals (with no socks).
- Regulation dark grey college pants are to be worn with grey school socks and black leather lace up school shoes, with a heel.
- Black socks are no longer an option.
- Tie is still compulsory for terms 2 & 3 and optional for terms 1 & 4.
- Either short or long sleeved shirt can be worn all year round. (Both long and short sleeved shirts are to be worn tucked in.)
- If the short sleeved shirt is preferred, it must be the new stiff collar short sleeved shirt, not the old styled summer shirt with soft collar.
