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Graduation 2011

A record 51 Year 13 students graduated this year at our 99th Longburn Adventist College Graduation. What was particularly pleasing is the number of our graduates who have already achieved Level 3 NCEA with either Merit or Excellence. In a group of 51 students the national average would be for one student to achieve their NCEA with an 'Excellence' endorsement but **nine** of our Year 13 Graduates have either achieved or are on track to achieve their Level 3 NCEA with Excellence!

Brent Costley from Massey University awarded three of our graduates (Kristina Whitton, Melissa Etuale-Wham & Laura Cullen) Massey High Achiever Awards. These awards are worth \$3000 each. In addition, Sarah Wilson received a Captain's Club award from Massey worth \$5000. Mr Costley remarked how most high schools did not receive one of these awards and how well LAC students have done to win 4!

The guest speaker for the weekend was Dr Barry Gane from Avondale College, NSW, and he awarded Setephano Noovao the President's Award from Avondale College. This prestigious award is worth over \$8000. Dr Gane spoke on the weekend theme of 'Masterpiece' reminding the graduates that they are all God's masterpieces designed for service to the Master.

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Annual Trip to Saniku, Japan

Each year LAC receives a group of Japanese students from our sister school in Hiroshima, Japan. These students stay here for 4-5 months and become a very important part of our school system. They board in the dormitories and enrich the campus with their diversity. Their fascinating culture seeps into the life of the school and adds a sense of excitement to the general school environment. Many of our Kiwi students here at LAC have had the opportunity to create friendships with the Saniku students through the Buddy system. Many of you also have been generous hosts to our Japanese students during the weekend homestays.

We are pleased we now have an exchange programme where LAC students visit Hiroshima Saniku Gakuin (High School) during the first term holidays of each year. This enables students from both Japan and New Zealand to share a little of each other's culture, history, language and talents. This exchange is mutually beneficial to students from both schools and it is pleasing to see the relationship growing with more LAC students making the trip. Students who have previously been on this trip engaged in Japanese language classes and involved themselves in a variety of activities such as Japanese calligraphy, Judo and other sporting events with our Saniku students in Hiroshima. They continue to carry lasting memories and speak fondly of their time in Japan. This trip is open to students from Yr. 11-13 (or age 15 and above) and has two options: a 4 week or an 8 week trip with tentative dates for 5 April - 29 May 2012. 
Joel Harvey

Most memorable day at school: Going into Miss Laney's room and cooking up some food whenever I was hungry.


Jonathan enjoyed **Photography** class the most because: "...I learnt how much a picture means."
