# ASPIRE ...

The ASPIRE programme which runs across the entire school is a deliberate attempt to provide students with core values and for them to be able to use them to equip them in preparing to meet the real world. The acronym represents six pillars and stands for:

Accomplishments, Skills, Purpose, Identity, Relationships, Empowerment.

Each fortnight a new value is brought before the students in a manner that informs, engages and challenges them to look at themselves and how they can reach their God-given potential and destiny.
